Print and complete the Model Competition Registration Form as you need it to enter the model into competition.

The registration form states that Scale Classes are judged by the current AMA Scale Rules with the exception of the 15 ft. distance rule.

Please read these rules for static judging before arriving at Toledo and preferably before you built your model.

The rules state that a scale model is a replica of a heavier than air aircraft that actually flew. To prove the model resembles a particular aircraft proof of scale documentation is required. This documentation is divided into two areas, proof of Accuracy of Outline and Finish, Color, & Marking. If no proof of Accuracy of Outline is provided, no points can be awarded. Likewise if no proof of Finish, Color, & Marking, is provided, no points can be awarded. In other words, if you do not provided documentation as stated in the rules, your aircraft will not be judged. Let me repeat this, if you do not provide documentation for this model your model will not be judged.

Your documentation is limited to eight pages. Your 3-view drawings are counted as one page.

You are allowed any of the three methods specified in the rules for proving Accuracy of Outline, although the plastic model method is not the preferred method.

Do not include pictures of your model during construction or in the finished state. The judges will not look at this and it will just waste some of your 8 page allowance.. You can make a separate document if you wish to show your construction or the model features to the attending public.

Bring the completed registration form and your documentation book to the Expo registration desk on Friday of the show from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Saturday morning from 8:30 a.m. to the noon deadline. There you will be checked in by the staff and they will keep your documentation book to give to the judges. Then you can place your model on the display table for everyone to admire.

That is all there is to registering your model for the scale expo competition.
